The Balboa Island Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) has been hard at work during 2010 to prepare our Island(s) in the event of a disaster. Upon receiving generous financial support from both the BIIA and the Little Island Association in late 2009, the Balboa CERT supplies sub-committee immediately went to work purchasing neighborhood emergency preparedness supplies for each of the three designated Incident Command Centers and storage facilities are now located on both the Big and Little Islands. These supplies, now stocked and ready at each of the three storage areas include:

1511 Balboa Avenue - Cecilia & Bruce Nott

The November Garden of the Month of Cecilia and Bruce Nott at 1511 Balboa Avenue wraps around the southwest corner of Abalone and Balboa Ave on the Little Island. Our Garden of the Month usually includes a plethora of colorful flowers, but this month's garden is "green" both in color and sustainability, being drought tolerant and requiring little water or care. The front yard facing Abalone Avenue is in two levels of raised terraces behind a Carrisa Holly hedge. Each white walled planter contains Blue Festuca Grass in front of succulents of Blue Agave, Hens and Chicks, and three large Jade plants. They are all scattered among several huge boulders under two Olive trees and a large Dasylyrion Plant in the center. The entry on Balboa Avenue is flanked by Himalayan bamboo, Star of Jasmine and Horsetail.
